**Highlight:** I interviewed **Dr. Eugenio Biagini**, Professor of History at Princeton University in the mid-1990s, when this was recorded (the past 25 years, he has taught at Cambridge University). Joining him in the interview were two other Princeton professors: Dr. Robert Prud-homme, a chemical engineering professor, and Dr. Robert Kaita, in the plasma physics lab. All three professors are Christian believers, and they shared a wonderful insights about how they dealt with skeptical questions. They explain how they ground their faith in the reality they've come to know.

**Dr. Biagini is brilliant** as he talks about how the Bible authors are open to writing about the "flaws" of biblical heroes. He details and describes the "historical professionalism" of biblical history accounts, adding that the question is whether modern historiography can match the high standards of biblical history writing!
